

Global Pandemic Inspires our Community to Come Together

Over the past 18 months our community has faced many challenges and obstacles surrounding the COVID-19 crisis. Here at Community Hospital of San Bernardino and St. Bernardine Medical Center we were so grateful to be able to remain focused on providing quality patient care thanks to the support of our dedicated health care workers and community supporters.

In 2020 we asked our community to help us stay safe by donating to our Emergency Response Fund and donating PPE to our hospitals. We are so grateful for the overwhelming amount of donations we received that included face masks, face shields, isolation gowns, gloves, sanitizer and in-kind donations of food and supplies for our frontline workers.

Last year Dignity Health Foundation - Inland Empire received over **\$830,000 dollars** in PPE, cash donations, and in-kind gifts to the Emergency Response Fund. This support has been essential in our efforts to respond to the COVID-19 crisis.

Since the beginning of the pandemic back in March of 2020, Community Hospital of San Bernardino and St. Bernardine Medical Center received thousands of donated meals from community members and partners.

These meals inspired our nurses and front line health care workers during one of the most difficult moments in our careers. We were able to experience firsthand how a donated meal can make one's entire day brighter.

Beyond meals donated by community members, both Dignity Health hospitals in the Inland Empire received support through PPE and in-kind donations.

Early in 2020, Avery Dennison generously donated over **80,000** face shields to our hospitals across the nation, including both hospitals in the Inland Empire. Gifts like this made it possible for our health care workers to stay safe in a rapidly changing health care environment.

To ensure the health and safety of our donors and community, Dignity Health Foundation - Inland Empire hosted our first large scale virtual event in December in honor of Giving Tuesday. Give to Care 2020 was a virtual music and comedy festival that benefited the Community Hospital of San Bernardino and St. Bernardine Medical Center Emergency Response Fund. With guest appearances from board members, hospital leaders, and award winning artists we had so much fun streaming this event for the enjoyment of our constituents.

In addition to our Give to Care virtual event, we hosted a Fall and Spring Charity Golf Classic. Thanks to our sponsors, and tournament players we raised over **\$313,000** for the two Dignity Health hospitals in the Inland Empire.

Dignity Health Vaccination Efforts

With the rollout of the COVID-19 vaccine in late 2020, Dignity Health made it a priority to provide our community with access to vaccinations.

Dignity Health staff and physicians have selflessly cared for thousands of COVID-19 positive patients over the past year. Nearly **35,000** COVID tests were conducted and over **16,700** vaccines administered through extensive efforts at our two San Bernardino hospitals and two urgent cares.

In addition to vaccinating patients at CHSB and SBMC, Dignity Health staff volunteered at the Dignity Health Sports Park vaccine clinic that vaccinated 20,000 vulnerable seniors and underserved individuals in less than one week's time.
