Changes to USP 797 for sterile compounding of IV medications require staff testing every 6 months with media fill and gloved fingertip sampling which must be incubated at two different temperature ranges for specific amounts of time.





# Dignity Health Foundation-IE Foundation Funded Over \$4M for Capital Equipment & Programs

## Funded by Foundation

### St. Bernardine Medical Center

**LivaNova CPS Heart Lung Bypass, Terumo Auto Transfusion Units, Quest MP3 3ND Heart Surgery**



**LivaNova** – heart-lung bypass machine that was over 20 years old. The new technology equipment is designed to improve patient safety with intuitive programmable modules and embedded safety features reducing human error. An updated bypass machine was needed in order to continue open heart program.

**Terumo Continuous Autotransfusion Units** – The technology collects the patient's blood during surgery, cleans it and approximately 80% is returned to the patient during open heart surgery. This process promotes faster healing and overall improves patient status compared to multiple blood transfusions. Essential to maintaining lower cost of surgery and improve patient outcomes.

**Quest MP3 3ND for Open Heart Surgery** – this system allows for precision with dosing and blood volume during surgery. This reduces need for blood products, reduces complications and improves patient outcomes.

**EUS/EBUS System and Intuitive ION**



EUS/EBUS system for expanding GI service as well as CT service lines to increase diagnostic capacity for cancer and treatment.

Ion system is robotic bronchoscopy for minimally invasive lung biopsies.

**Emergency Department Ultrasound**



A new current technology ultrasound unit to ensure safe and timely care to our most critical and vulnerable patients. The current ultrasound was outdated and could not keep up with patient volume.

Glass walls were installed to create a dedicated space in the rehabilitation services for employees to use the gym equipment in the gym area.
